- Garr Reynolds, "Presentation Zen" (dt. "Zen oder die Kunst der Präsentation"), 2nd edition If you're only going to buy one book about presenting and presentations, consider this one.
- Nancy Duarte, "slide:ology" (dt. ditto) Probably the most comprehensive book on slide design.

Dr. John Medina, "Brain Rules" (dt. "Gehirn und Erfolg") What we know (and don't know) about how our brain really works (hint: not like a VCR). Chapters 4, 5, and 6 about attention, short-term and long-term memory should be required reading for every presenter.

Chip & Dan Heath, "Made to Stick" (dt. "Was bleibt") The Heath brothers look at everything from successful marketing campaigns to urban legends to figure out what makes us remember them and come up with the SUCCESs principles.

Scott Berkun, "Confessions of a Public Speaker" (dt. "Bekenntnisse eines Redners") Musings and occasional rants of a professional speaker. Good read, but not really usable as a reference.
